COOK SHIRE IS OPEN FOR BUSINESS

Cook Shire and most other Cape York shires are currently open to visitation, subject to Queensland

border restrictions. Travellers are advised to maintain social distancing and personal hygiene measures and adhere to all regulatory requirements and community access protocols.

SMOKE ALERT

The Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service (QPWS) will be conducting planned burning operations within the Annan River (Yuku Baja-Muliku) and Endeavour River national parks during August and September 2020, weather permitting, as part of the annual hazard reduction and conservation management program for parks and forests.

As a result, smoke may be seen in the Cooktown and Marton areas.

The aim of this burn is to reduce the volume of forest fuels and to create a mosaic pattern of burnt and unburnt areas.

This will help reduce the intensity of any subsequent wildfires, and provide favourable conditions for natural forest regeneration.

Smoke can decrease visibility on the roads, so it is important that motorists drive safely to the conditions.
