



Councillor Code of Conduct Register (July 2020 to June 2021)

Local Government Act 2009 Sections 150DX, 150DY, 150DZ

As of May 2018, Local Governments are required to keep and publish a Councillor Code of Conduct Register detailing orders made about unsuitable meeting conduct of councillors, decisions relating to suspected inappropriate conduct of councillors, decisions about whether or not a councillor engaged in misconduct or inappropriate conduct, dismissed complaints about the conduct of a councillor, and matters investigated about councillor conduct taken no further.

That the councillor was not taking materials from behind the site office where council would place materials for sale and was not wearing any PPE.	Cr Ross Logan	Decision: 17/12/20	The OIA decided to take no further action pursuant to section 150Y(b)(iii) of the Local Government Act 2009 [the Act] on the basis that taking further action would be an unjustifiable use of resources. The OIA considered that at the time of the alleged conduct, council did not have a formal policy for the buyback shop operations at council's waste facility, that the councillor could have breached, the OIA has written to the CEO recommending council implement and communicate a formal policy.	10/11/2021
