Approach

The Study

Cook Shire Council commissioned CATALYSE® to assist with the completion of a MARKYT® Community Scorecard.

The study was open to all community members aged 14 years and older. Responses could be submitted in print or online between 24 April and 2 June.

The Council sought to raise awareness and participation in the study through various marketing activities. This included distributing hard copies of the scorecard across Cook Shire, promoting the study through social media notifications, and seeking support from local groups (such as schools, sporting clubs and other community organisations) to invite their contacts to take part.








The scorecard was completed by 415 community members with various connections to the Shire:

















Community action plans for top six priorities

Community Action Plan Access to housing

Community driven actions

- Advocate for more social housing solutions for vulnerable people, including seniors, young people and people who are homeless.
- Increase housing supply with consideration for releasing more land and allowing smaller block sizes.
- Work with major employers (including government agencies) to identify opportunities to increase housing and accommodation options and reduce FIFO roles.

Sample of community voices

"More advocacy for public housing or Commonwealth funds for more affordable housing options."

"For the ever-growing underprivileged individuals and the needy, mental health, unmarried mothers, to build housing commission complexes to provide safe home environments for the poor of our shire."

"Relief from long waiting list from Department of housing. More houses for low-income earner for every race/nationality."

"Provide a way for people to purchase smaller blocks in Lakeland to build a house."

"Much improved housing supply at affordable cost for both renting or buying."

"There is not really any rental housing in Cooktown. Takes months to wait for a rental. Not sure how CSC can increase this, but it would bring more people to the area if there was housing available."

"Cooktown's housing crisis is appalling and is preventing growth of the town and community. We can not attract and retain professionals and families if there are not houses for them to live in. Council needs to invest in a housing development to grow our community."

"Provide more housing for locals and not government workers/employees who are flown in for the big dollars. Provide accommodation for those who can't afford \$450-\$600. Small little units will do"

"Too many government department's staff are taking up rentals with only one person to each 3 to 4 bedroom residence."



Community Action Plan Health and community services

Community driven actions

- Advocate for urgent upgrades to the hospital to expand capacity and improve facilities such as a maternity ward.
- Advocate for better access to health services to reduce wait times and the need to travel to Cairns or Mareeba. Attract more permanent and visiting GPs and specialists, including dentists.
- Advocate for improved access to health services for residents of Lakeland.

Sample of community voices

"Desperately need a new hospital. Cook Shire is a huge area."

"Upgrade health services and infrastructure."

"Not enough specialised health services available. Example -Most people need a CT scan, this is not available in Cooktown."

"Birthing services in Cooktown."

"A larger hospital that also has a maternity ward and other available health services to reduce the need to constantly go elsewhere for health services"

"We need more specialist services so we don't have to go to Cairns.

Also, more GPs in town so appointments are available in the needed timeframe, rather than having to go to the hospital system."

"Encourage more GPs to come to town. Trying to get an appointment is difficult and can take more than two weeks. Attending the Emergency Dept at the hospital can also mean long waits to get attention."

"Access to basic dental care and health needs without having to travel 100s kms or wait weeks."

"More health services such as dental."

"Have, at least once a month, a doctor or registered nurse available for Lakeland residents to access."

"We need medical services in Lakeland for young families and seniors. There is nothing. If we want young families to stay in Lakeland we need these services."



Community Action Plan Local roads and bridges

Community driven actions

- Improve the speed and quality of repairs and maintenance of the road network and verges:
 - o Increase frequency of grading
 - Repair potholes
 - Clear weeds and grass from edges
 - Remove rubbish and abandoned vehicles
- Facilitate the sealing of gravel roads:
 - · Urban and residential roads
 - · Agricultural access roads
- Upgrade and repair bridges so they are in use during the wet season.

Sample of community voices

"There are an abundance of roads that are in disarray. Regular maintenance and repair not simply patch work is needed."

"Slashing of long grass on road sides following wet months and quicker repairs to roads near Cooktown. Also, gravel streets."

"Improve / seal some outlying local roads for residents, to improve access to their properties, especially during the wet season."

"Seal urban roads in all communities. Seal access to agricultural areas, not tourist destinations. Look after locals, not tourists."

"Have roads open and useable ASAP so remote people, ie. Stations, can get fuel, supplies and cattle to market in a reasonable condition. Not have the roads regraded just before the wet starts. What about the 6 months before."

"Too many potholes on dirt roads, unsafe bridges."

"Local roads and bridges. Build bridges that are still crossable in the wet season."

"When Council don't commence works on roads until beginning of August, our unsealed roads are atrocious to drive! It not only does your head in trying to get to work each day BUT, it's wrecking our vehicles!"

> "More pro-active on roadside littering and illegal dumping. Removal of crashed and abandoned cars."

"Grade local unsealed roads between April and September, taking into account some people travel up to 80km daily to and from work into Cooktown."

"Roads need to be maintained all year round, not done at the end of the year, then they are wrecked by the wet season - And we have to wait until October for good roads again."



Community Action Plan

Community safety and crime prevention

Community driven actions

- · Advocate for greater parent support and responsibility.
- Provide a safe space for young people to go at night.
- Advocate for a 24-hour police station and greater police presence.
- Provide more street lighting and CCTV surveillance to improve personal safety and security for local businesses and community organisations.

Sample of community voices

"Keep the youth busy and occupied. Put pressure on parents to take responsibility."

"Make parents more responsible by introducing heavy fines."

"Keeping kids off the streets at night so shire residents feel safe in their homes. Far too many break-ins all over town."

"Address youth issue of youths roaming at night."

"Massive crack down needs to happen on youth crime as it is not only damaging facilities such as the football club and pool but many local businesses. This damages the attraction of our town to locals and visitors alike."

"Advocate for 24 hour police station. More lighting."

"Push the State Government for a twenty-four hour police service."

"Needs to be more police available at the right times. Perhaps one stationed at small communities over different weekends."

"Neighbourhood Watch set ups in Cooktown. Lobby Queensland Govt for more police and patrols at night."

"CCTV in areas that destruction commonly occur, penalties for the ones responsible, decisive action with crocodiles in areas where people often occupy."

"CCTV in public areas to deter crime."

"Crime is through the roof. Improved public services to help locals, clubs and businesses affected by the ridiculous rise is crime and vandalism due to youth."



Community Action Plan Youth services and facilities

Community driven actions

- Support community organisations that provide services and host activities for young people.
- Provide recreational facilities such as an outdoor basketball court.
- Provide safe spaces for young people to meet and socialise, including the evenings and on weekends.
- Provide a greater range of activities to keep young people engaged.
- Consult with young people to identify what they want and allow them to be part of the solution.

Sample of community voices

"More support into youth activities and backing including PCYC activities after school and over weekends"

"Outside basketball court that youth can access after hours. Support for youth to help them engage in local opportunities"

"There is very little for the kids to do here. Sport and rec officers do a decent job but we need activities/spaces in communal, well-lit, areas of the community that the community can access without needing the sport and rec officer to facilitate things (like local parks in cairns etc.)"

"Create more opportunities for youth re: activities, inclusion in community, sports, drop in centre, after school activities, external education (after school), ie. Life skills.

"Increase youth programs and infrastructure to support programs"

"Support already established sports and community centers to increase programs that attract youth"

"More out of hours activities and opportunities for youth."

"Increase opportunities for youth education and employment."

"There is nothing in this town for young people over the age of 10-12 to do. The community should be encouraging young adults to socialise and spend time with one another and connect better with the community in general, but there's just no facilities or activities for them."

"Create more facilities where youth can meet, create, in safe spaces. Provide local job opportunities in small town communities for locals, ie., Youth Club Co-ordinator, or regular library services by local librarians."

"Support youth initiatives and consult with youth on what they want."



Community Action Plan

Animal management (dogs and cats)

Community driven actions

- Educate pet owners about their responsibilities and consequences of failing to meet them.
- Tighten pet ownership requirements, and enforcement of rules and regulations by impounding pets and issuing infringement notices and fines.
- · Provide free desexing services for pets.
- Provide more patrols to monitor for stray and feral cats and dogs.

Sample of community voices

"The dogs roaming the streets is worse than it's ever been. It's a danger to other pets, wildlife, children etc. and is a deterrent to return tourists. Stronger penalties financially need to apply to negligent pet owners. Council needs to be a lot stronger on this."

"There are so many wandering dogs in town and a lot of neglected, poorly cared for animals. Some sort of initiative or support should be provided to either remove animals from neglectful homes or provide well meaning owners with additional support to care for their animals."

"Roaming animals - Dogs are out of control.

Can't walk down the street without issues."

"The dogs roaming around town are a major concern and worry us as parents with young kids. I feel it's only a matter of time until there is a tragic incident involving a roaming pig dog."

"Too many roaming dogs in town area. Many residents feel unsafe to walk around the streets with their own dogs. Recent attacks on residents with their dogs restrained. Stray dogs also enter yards and are a menace. Nothing is done."

> "Animal management. More restrictions and more fines for free range / roaming animals, as people are becoming at risk."

> > "More patrolling by council officer to pick up stray dogs. Perhaps reintroduction of cat registration."

"Restrictions on dog ownership for those who do not care for their animals."


"Address the feral cat / dog problems around Lakeland. Make a vet available full time and do free desexing of animals."


> "Cats should be kept inside their owners houses and not left to roam and decimate the local fauna."














