"It is a great nostalgic event to watch, and in front of the historic buildings it is easy to picture Cooktown in the gold-rush heyday, with weary packhorses bringing back a small fortune and the threat of bushrangers imminent," Cook Shire Mayor Peter Scott said.

The Cooktown Discovery Festival is an annual event, with this year's festival running from Friday, June 15 to Sunday, June 17. Stand out events include the gold delivery, the reenactment of James Cook's historic landing at the Endeavour River, fireworks, the Indigenous Warrma, billy kart races and the grand parade. The gold delivery starts at 11am on Saturday on Charlotte Street near the old bank.
