WHAT PLASTICS CAN I RECYCLE IN COOKTOWN?

It is free to recycle most plastic food containers, however many other plastics are not recyclable.

Before recycling your plastics, check to make sure your containers have a recycling symbol. Bottles should have the recycling symbol, as well as a single number, from 1 to 7.

If you aren't sure, or the container doesn't have a recycling symbol, please dispose of it with your general rubbish. Recyclables can be disposed of at any Shire waste transfer station or at our recycling skips. Check the waste management secion of our website for more details.
