PUBLIC INVITED TO ENJOY WATERFRONT SITE

The Cooktown waterfront, including the children's water park, will be open to the public from Friday, June 15.

There is plenty of space for all the family, with the viewing and fishing platforms, gym equipment and water play park open for use. There is still some work ongoing on some aspects of the project, but the site is now safe and open for the public to enjoy. The coin operated barbecues are expected to be connected to power in coming weeks, and the exercise stations and walkways, featuring engraved pavers, are all accessible.

Visitors to the area are asked to be mindful of the areas of freshly laid turf and growing grass, and stay to the paths where possible. The children's water park is expected to be open on weekends, school and public holidays, with definite operating hours still to be finalised. When it is completed, the site will include further landscaping and the kiosk will be opened. A gala official opening is planned for later this year.

ALL THE FUN OF THE FESTIVAL

One of Cooktown's biggest annual events, the Cooktown Discovery Festival, kicks off this Friday.

The three day event features a full program of fun, including rides, grand parade, scavenger hunt, billy karts, fireworks and the re-enactment of the indigenous people's meeting with Captain Cook in 1770.

FIREWORKS EXCLUSION ZONE

Boat users must not moor or boat within the zone, which is a 160m diameter circle adjacent to Bicentennial Park.

KEEP YOUR PETS SAFE

As exciting as the fireworks and musket and cannon firing is for us, our pets often don't appreciate the loud noises.

Cannon firing will take place in Endeavour Park on Sunday, June 17 at about 11am. The musket firing will take place on Friday, June 15 at the Sovereign Resort Hotel at 6pm and on Sunday, June 17 in Bicentennial Park between 9.30am and 11am. The fireworks are in Bicentennial Park from 7.45pm on Saturday, June 16. To ensure your pets are safe during these events, please keep them in a secure location. If your pet does go missing, remember to contact Council to report it.

CHECK YOUR WATER METER

Have you checked your water meter this month for hidden leaks?

It's quick and easy to do and could save you an excess water charge. Make sure all your taps are turned off, then check your meter. If no red dials are moving, it means there is no leak. If the red dials are moving, there is water leaking somewhere, so time to investigate. Tips include checking for wet areas around taps and your yard, or unusually green grass.

If you cannot find any visible signs of a leak, you may need to call a plumber.

COUNCIL GRANTS STREAMLINED

Council's grants programs are being streamlined to make the process easier for applicants.

Council's in-kind support program is being replaced by a community donations program, which is open year-round for applications under \$1000.

The current sponsorship program is being replaced by a \$1000 to \$3000 community sponsorship program, which is open twice a year.

The community and economic development grants program is being replaced with the community small grants program, open twice a year for amounts up to \$5000. Visit the grants page on Council's website or contact our Grants Officer for more information.
