Council delivers \$2.3 million of Works for Queensland projects across Cape York

Thanks to the Queensland Government's Works for Queensland program, Cook Shire Council has successfully delivered \$2.3 million of works across Cook Shire. These projects created 76 jobs, and provided vital maintenance and improvements to facilities across our vast Shire.

MAYTOWN ROAD RESURVEY AND MAINTENANCE GRADE



The popular historical Maytown goldfields are now more accessible, following a resurvey and maintenance grade to Maytown Road. The road has also been resurveyed.

WASTEWATER RENEWAL AND UPGRADE PROJECT

Cooktown and Coen's wastewater infrastructure has had a boost with this project, which included manhole relining, infiltration repairs and replacement of mixers, pumps and decant pipes. The project also included upgrades to the town wastewater plants.

CHARLOTTE STREET RENEWAL - BANKS STREET TO SEAVIEW MOTEL



Part of the Charlotte Street Revitalisation Strategy for Cooktown's main street, this project provided a full reseal to the existing surface and a seal to the gravel verges, extending the life of this vital infrastructure.

NATURE'S POWERHOUSE ROOF UPGRADE



Maintenance and improvements to rainwater disposal at Nature's PowerHouse, which houses Cooktown's Visitor Information Centre and the Vera Scarth-Johnson Gallery, will extend the life of this important community facility.

LAURA FOOTPATH EXTENSION

Safety has been improved in the community of Laura, with the existing footpath extended from the Peninsula Development Road towards Laura township.

REPAIRS TO JS LOVE BUILDING COEN



The much loved historical JS Love building in Coen has a new lease on life, following works which included balcony repairs, painting, plumbing and electrical maintenance. The repairs will allow the building to be utilised by the Coen community as well as visiting services, and provides much needed rented office and accommodation space.

ROSSVILLE COMMUNITY HALL

Disaster resilience has been boosted in the Rossville area with repairs to the community hall, which is the residents' place of refuge during a disaster event. Work completed included repairs to guttering and roofing, and replacing the toilet steps and walkway.

INSTALLATION OF WALLABY PROOF FENCE AROUND LAURA AERODROME

Public safety has been improved at the Laura Aerodrome, with fencing installed to keep wallabies and other animals off the runway.

LAKELAND RECREATIONAL PARK



Working with the Lakeland Progress Association, Council has cleared the Lakeland Sport and Recreation Area, and completed the final gradient and spreading of topsoil. This will allow further funding to be sourced for the installation of a multipurpose playing field and player and spectator amenities.

PORTLAND ROADS COMMUNITY HALL

The Portland Roads hall now boasts a shower and toilet, as well as repairs to the gutter and roof. The new facilities will be utilised by residents and workers staying in the area.

BLOOMFIELD COMMUNITY HALL



Bloomfield Valley residents have an upgraded community hall following the completion of this project. Works included drainage, and plumbing, electrical, painting and roof maintenance and repairs.

SHADE FOR COOKTOWN SKATE PARK

Council installed a shaded picnic table as part of its ongoing commitment to upgrading community facilities. The skate park is a popular space for local and visiting youth.
