MULCH AVAILABLE AT THE TIP

Now is the time to mulch your gardens before the dry season sets in, and Council has you covered.

Mulch is now available at the Cooktown Waste Transfer Station either to self load, or you can get the friendly Council team to load your vehicle. You can also get mulch delivered right to your door.

Mulch costs \$5 per cubic metre for self loading, \$10 per cubic metre for Council loading, or \$5 per cubic metre plus a \$30 delivery fee for a ute load or \$95 delivery fee for a truck load.
