PLAN TO BE WATERWISE DURING A DISASTER

Having access to adequate supplies of water during and immediately after a disaster such as a cyclone is an important part of protecting your health.

However, water may not be available or safe to drink during and immediately after a disaster. As a result, you should include adequate supplies of safe drinking water in your emergency kit, and fill water containers and bathtubs at home for essential use.

Immediately following a disaster, when water is turned back on, strict water restrictions will be in place until notified otherwise by Council. Please be mindful of the limited water supply and ensure all residents have access to adequate water by not using more than necessary for essential hygeine, cooking and drinking purposes only.
