# TAKING COOKTOWN AND CAPE YORK ON THE ROAD

Council's Tourism and Events team are marketing the region across Australia at a trade show in Brisbane this week and Melbourne next week.

#### MOSQUITO CONTROL TIPS

An increase in mosquitoes during the wet season means an increased risk of contracting a mosquito-borne disease.

Simple measures such as removing items that can carry water and doing a weekly yard tidy up can help reduce the risk of mosquito-borne diseases.

Mosquitoes can breed in water-filled containers or objects such as buckets, pot plant bases, vases, tarpaulins, old tyres, bird baths, and palm fronds. Mosquitos found in or around your home can carry diseases such as Ross River virus and dengue fever.

You can also reduce the risk of mosquito bites by using electric mosquito zappers, mosquito coils and surface spray and wearing light, loose long-sleeved clothing and insect repellent when outdoors.
