TREE THREAT TO SHIRE HALL TO BE REMOVED

A tree which is threatening the historical Shire Hall and water and sewer lines in Cooktown will be removed next week.

The milky pine and attached fig in front of the heritage-listed building on Helen Street were assessed by an independent arborist, who found the plants were damaging the building's foundations and also located directly above the water and sewer lines which service the street.

Work on tree removal is scheduled to start on Monday, March 16, and be completed over several days.

While in the area, the contractors will also remove a dangerous rotten mango tree on West Street and large blue gum on Broadway Street in Ayton to protect public safety.

SAILING CRUISE SHIP STOPPING IN COOKTOWN

The distinctive luxury cruise ship Wind Spirit is scheduled to bring her 140 passengers to Cooktown on March 15.

The four-masted ship is booked to arrive at 10am and leave at 4pm. Council staff will be at the wharf to greet the visitors, and local businesses are encouraged to make them feel welcome.

Applications are open until March 31 for the Charlotte Street Streetscape and Facade Beautification Program.

PUBLIC ARTWORK WANTED FOR RECONCILIATION SITE

Cook Shire Council is inviting submissions for the creation of public artwork as part of the Reconciliation Rocks Precinct Development Project.

It is proposed to establish a cultural space, including landscaping and public art, at the site of the first recorded act of reconciliation. The Traditional Owners in Cooktown and surrounding areas want to tell the story of the naming of the kangaroo (Gangurru) and the first act of reconciliation between the 'little old man', who, upholding the laws of the Guugu Yimithirr lands, came forward to resolve a conflict that had taken place between James Cook and the Waymburr-Warra people during Cook's 48 day stay in 1770.

The public art will form part of the fabric of this important site, which will commemorate the first act of reconciliation and inform visitors on the significance of the event that occurred on the site. Submissions are due by Tuesday, March 31 2020.
