CAPE FLATTERY SILICA SAND PROJECT



Progressive Rehabilitation and Closure Plan

Metallica Minerals is developing a Progress Rehabilitation and Closure Plan (PRCP) as part of the Cape Flattery Silica Sand Project (CFS). This Plan is an important element of the Queensland Government's Mined Land Rehabilitation Policy.

The PRCP will become an environmental roadmap for the life of the project, both during and after operations end, guiding how rehabilitation is progressively delivered and achieved. Once developed, this Plan will be submitted to The Department of Environment and Science.

Community members and key stakeholders are invited to provide comment and feedback for consideration in the development of the PRCP. Metallica Minerals will undertake an engagement program, including a two-day in-person consultation program in Hopevale and Cooktown.

About the PRCP

A PRCP requires Metallica Minerals to plan for how and where activities will be carried out on the land at the CFS Project in a way that maximises the progressive rehabilitation of the land to a stable condition.

A PRCP consists of two parts:

- 1. A rehabilitation plan
- 2. PRCP schedule.

About the project

CFS is a long-life silica sand project producing high-quality silica sand for the booming Asia-Pacific glass manufacturing markets supplying the solar panel industry.

The CFS project is located on the eastern coastline of Cape York Peninsula and approximately 220km north of Cairns in North Queensland. The Project is located within the Cape Flattery Port area.
