NEW PROGRAMS, NEW HOURS FOR COOKTOWN POOL

Things are heating up at the Cooktown Pool, literally, and summer hours are starting this month.

From September 18, the pool will be open from 6am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, and 1pm to 6pm on weekends. The inflatable obstacle course will also be in the pool on Tuesday and Thursday of the school holidays (September 19, 21, 26 and 28).

The Transition to Swim Club classes also kick of next week, from 9.30am between September 18 and 22 and there are free Learn to Swim classes for children 6 months to 5 years old from September 24 to October 2.

For youngsters who aren't quite ready for Learn to Swim, there are toddlers' water introduction sessions, for children aged 6 months to 4 years old, every Thursday at 10am. Toddler sessions start on October 5, and no bookings are required.

There are also two new programs aimed at adults, with the Senior Swans program tailored to suit mature women with a leisurely, social swim squad. Adult Squad is for all adults who like a focused group swim training program aimed at improving stroke and fitness.

NEW RESERVOIR FOR LAKELAND TOWN WATER

Lakeland's town water supply has been given a new lease on life, with the old rusting reservoir replaced with a new larger tank.

The old 160kL tank was about 50 years old, and was replaced with a new 270kL tank to meet the increased demands for town water in the growing community.

Council is also working with the community and stakeholders to develop a long term sustainable water suppy and usage plan for the area, with an \$825,000 feasibility study underway.

COOKTOWN AVIATION PARK WORKS UNDERWAY

A new taxiway linking the runway with the Cooktown Airport Aviation Park lease area is underway.

The \$1.85 million project is funded by the Department of State Development's Building Our Region's Fund and the Department of Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning's Works for Queensland program.

The 550m taxiway, which runs parallel to the runway, has been designed to comply with requirements for the large passenger Dash 8 aircraft and will include double layer cement stabilised pavement topped with double coat bitumen.
