RESPONSE TO INFORMATION REQUEST RECONFIGURATION OF A LOT – 1 INTO 4 LOTS LOCATED AT 386 CAMERON CREEK ROAD, COOKTOWN FORMALLY DESCRIBED AS LOT 36 ON SP297334

We wish to respond to Council's information request received on the 29 January 2024 in accordance with section 12 of the Development Assessment Rules.

2. Submit an amended proposed plan of development detailing building envelops for each of the proposed lots, including the existing approved building envelope over proposed Lot 4. The building envelopes must include all dimensions, including access driveway handles.

Flood Hazard

The subject site is identified as a Potential Flood Hazard Area on the Flood and Other Coastal Hazard Overlay map. The planning report submitted with the development application has not addressed compliance with the Flood and Other Coastal Hazards Overlay Code (8.2.6).

- 3. Provide a detailed response to the Flood and Other Coastal Hazards Overlay Code.
- **4.** If necessary, amend the site plan to show the proposed building envelopes are located in an area that provides maximum possible flood immunity for the safety of people and the protection of property for all flood events.

Comment:

This response also corresponds with item 5 regarding stormwater drainage, as it is simply stormwater flow paths that correlate with the flood hazard mapping. The site is mapped within a vast expanse of area within the 'Potential Flood Hazard Area'. Our clients can attest that even in the recent record flood events from Cyclone Jasper which were greater than 1 in 100-year events, that the property did not flood whatsoever. The site is some 30m above the creek level to the north, so extremely unlikely any flooding would ever occur in this area.

The building envelopes on proposed Lot 2 & 3 however have been amended to avoid the drainage flow paths, therefore providing maximum flood immunity for the protection of property and infrastructure.

Stormwater Drainage

Review of available Lidar ground surface information for the site overlaid with the proposed lot layout and Building Envelope Plan indicates the building envelope for proposed Lot 2 and Lot 3 may be impacted by existing drainage flow paths through the development site. Refer figure below.

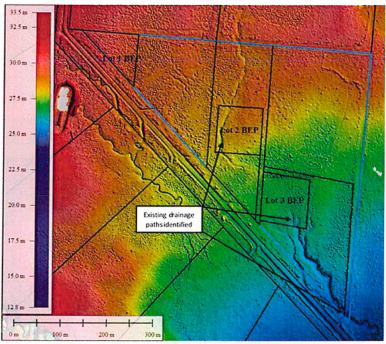


Figure: Existing Drainage Flow Paths Identified within Development Site



- **5.** Provide a drainage study addressing the following drainage paths as indicated by Lidar level data:
 - a. Existing flow path through the proposed Lot 2 building envelope;
 - b. Existing flow path in the south-east corner of the Lot 3 building envelope;
 - c. Existing flow path through the Lot 4 driveway access; and
 - d. The mitigation measures required to minimise the impacts described in a, b, and c.

Comment:

As noted in the flood hazard section above, and in response to not providing a drainage study — costly and unjustified — we have simply amended the building envelopes to address the flow paths as shown on the LIDAR mapping to address all concerns in item 5. The building envelopes were also amended and reduced in size to address concerns raised with SARA regarding the vegetation clearing. As such, these changes will address both parties concerns at the same time.

In terms of the flow path across the access for proposed lot 4, we wish to note that that access is existing and has already been approved (Council file reference DA/3910). The access location and building envelope to now proposed Lot 4 has therefore been settled and not to be considered again or addressed as part of this application. In terms of access in and out, the property can be accessed all year round with rocks placed within the wetter areas to protect access.

Proposed Lot 1 access driveway location

The proposed access driveway for proposed Lot 1 is located on a corner and may not achieve sufficient safe intersection sight distance from oncoming traffic on Cameron Creek Road. This is particularly relevant after a wet season when high vegetation growth in road verges typically occurs.

6. Provide a Traffic Engineering Report demonstrating safe intersection sight distance can be achieved from the proposed Lot 1 driveway access at the north-west corner of the proposed Building Envelope. The site distance assessment must consider the vegetation growth within the road reserve.

Comment:

As discussed in the meeting, conducting a traffic engineering report is not an option and somewhat cost prohibitive, particularly when there is a simply alternative option that addresses the concern. Moving forward to address this matter, we have simply shifted the crossover to the furthermost point of the building envelope on proposed Lot 1. That pushes the access some 160m from the corner, which is greater than the 120m separation recently approved in DA/4648.



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION Existing cleared areas within proposed Lot 1

1. Council is aware that recent vegetation clearing has been undertaken within proposed Lot 1. It is noted that the planning report submitted with the application did not mention the vegetation clearing. It is noted that in accordance with the Referral Agency response for the development approval creating Lot 36 SP297334 (SARA Ref: 1804-5064 and Council file reference DA/3910) vegetation clearing was in accordance with the approved plan and limited to the approved building envelope located in the north-eastern corner (location of building envelope for proposed Lot 4).

Please confirm if relevant approvals under the *Vegetation Management Act 1999* have been obtained for the clearing of native vegetation.

Comment:

The clearing conducted on the property does not relate to any local government interests, rather state interest. With that in mind, it might be best advised to leave matters to be controlled by the relative respective party. We have been advised by the client that the clearing on-site was along the boundary 10m for fire separation. Regardless of all that, it is evidenced from this application that proposed Lot 1 will have a large building envelope area some 7,000m² to which it will be approved to be cleared. Relevant approvals under the *Vegetation Management Act 1999* have been submitted through this application process, and approvals will be forthcoming.

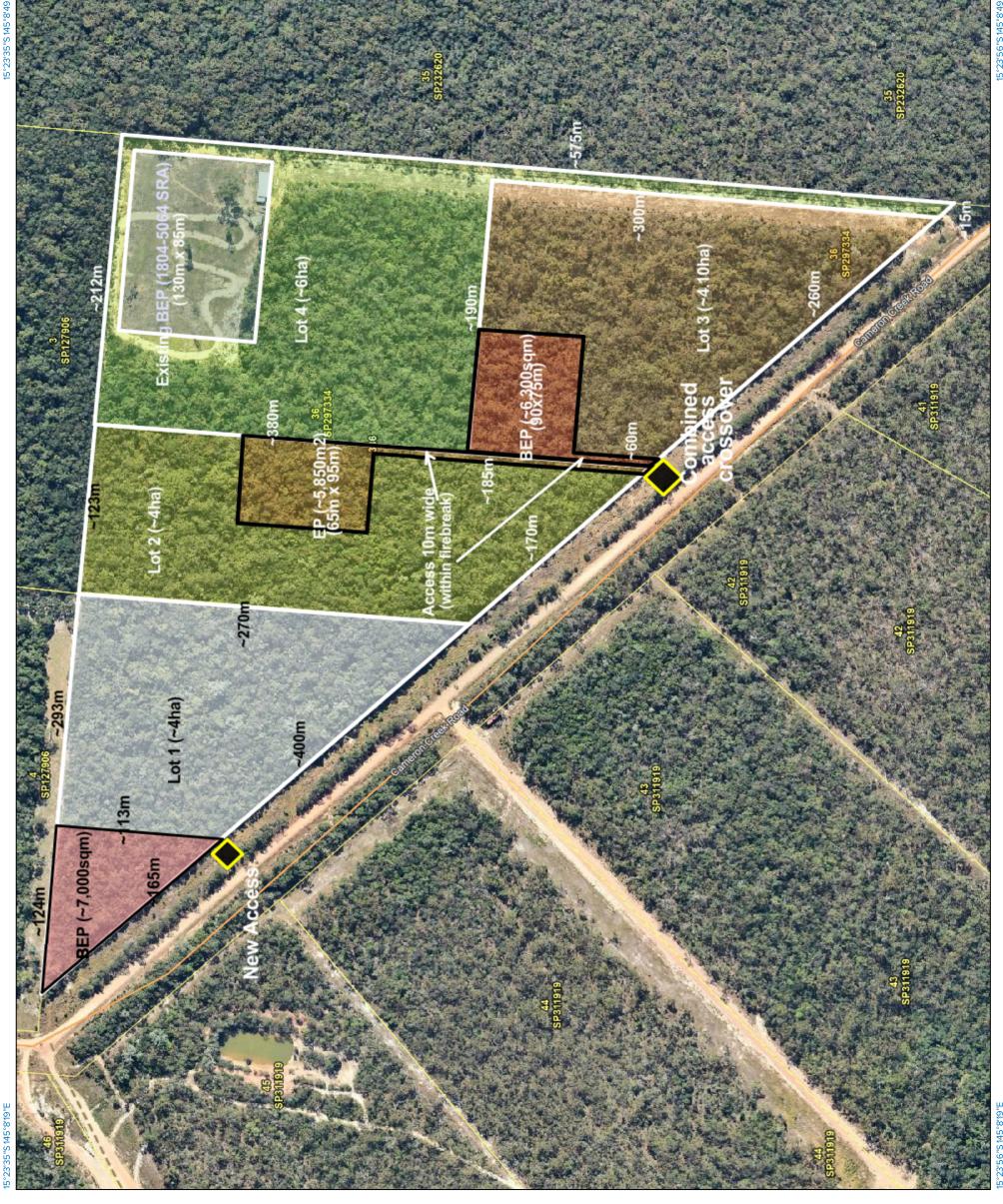

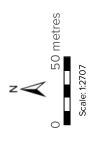
